Report On Student Feedback Forms (2023)

Students from the 3rd and 5th semesters of the department were invited to participate in a structured feedback exercise aimed at evaluating the institution's academic performance. A total of 54 students provided their responses, offering critical insights into various aspects of the academic framework. The gathered feedback has been systematically analyzed to generate a statistical report assessing institutional performance across ten essential areas. This comprehensive analysis serves as a foundational tool for establishing a quality profile for the academic year, consistent with the institution's strategic vision and objectives. Furthermore, the findings will contribute significantly to the development of a quality index profile aimed at fostering continuous improvement and enhancing overall institutional effectiveness.

The feedback form utilized a five-point Likert scale, where students rated their experience as follows: . 1 - Strongly Disagree

- 2 Disagree 6 3 - Neutral
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- 4 Agree
- 5 Strongly Agree .

The responses reflect students' perceptions of institutional performance, helping in strategic decision-making and future enhancements.

- 3. Fostering Analytical Thinking: Introducing assignments and discussion forums aimed at enhancing critical and analytical skills.
- 4. Improvement of Reference Materials: Providing updated reading lists with diverse resources, including research articles and relevant textbooks.
- 5. Encouragement of Higher Education: Conducting academic counseling and awareness programs to support students pursuing advanced studies.
- 6. **Promotion of Practical Knowledge Application:** Incorporating case studies, field visits, and project-based learning to bridge the gap between theory and practice.
- 7. Enhancing Employability: Collaborating with industry experts to provide skill development programs and career guidance workshops.
- 8. Supporting Self-Study and Research: Encouraging research-oriented learning through conferences, seminars, and supervised projects.
- 9. Sustained Feedback Mechanism: Establishing a regular feedback system to monitor progress and continuously improve the curriculum.

The implementation of these action points is expected to significantly enhance the effectiveness of the syllabus, improve student satisfaction, and align the curriculum with the evolving academic and industry standards.
