Report On Student Feedback Forms (2024)

A total of **68 students** submitted their responses, offering valuable insights into the institution's academic activities. Based on this feedback, a **statistical report** has been compiled to assess institutional performance across ten key areas. This analysis aids in establishing a **quality profile** for the year, aligning with the institution's **vision and goals**. The findings will contribute to developing a **quality index profile** for continuous improvement.

The feedback form utilized a five-point Likert scale, where students rated their experience as follows:

- 1 Strongly Disagree
- 2 Disagree
- 3 Neutral
- 4 Agree
- 5 Strongly Agree

The responses reflect students' perceptions of institutional performance, helping in strategic decisionmaking and future enhancements.
